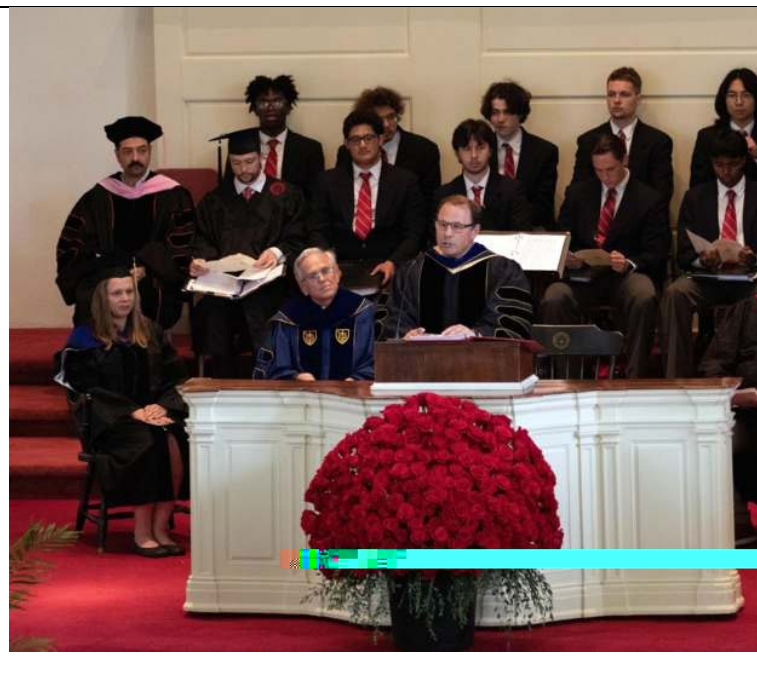

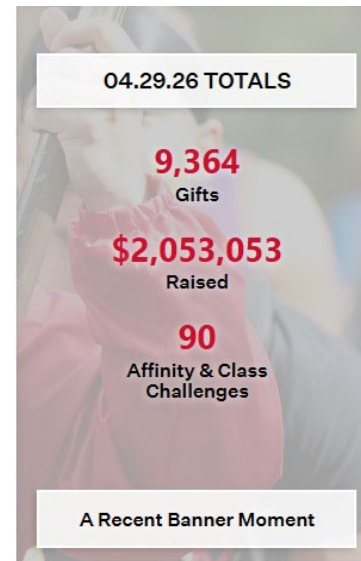


DAY OF GIVING (DOG) THANK YOU!

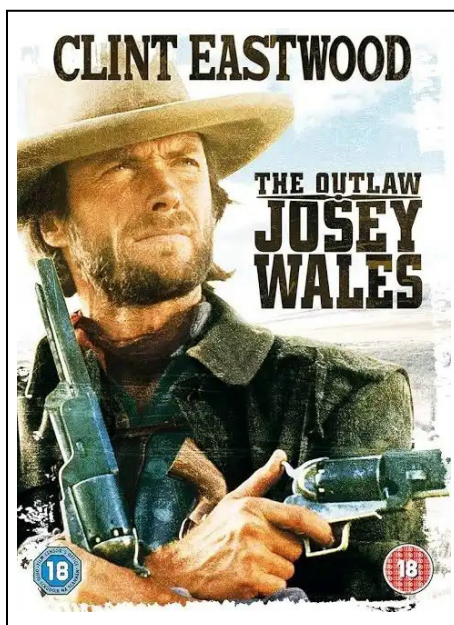
